

- CCP can be offered different ways
 - In the building with KAP, COTC classes
 - At a college campus of your choosing COTC, MVNU, OSU etc.
 - Online through a college ex. Cedarville, Tiffin
- CCP is free as long as you pass the class
 - Grades are not listed on your progressbook but are added to your transcript at the end of the semester
 - Books are paid for as well but you may have to turn them back in
 - If you fail the class, you will reimburse the high school for the tuition
ex. Currently \$166.28 per credit hour at COTC (\$498.84 for a 3 sem. hour class)
Ex. Currently \$166.55 per credit hour at MVNU (\$499.65 for a 3 sem. hour class)
- You have to qualify to be involved in CCP
 - GPA of 2.75 or higher with a B or higher in a relevant class
 - Some classes require an accuplacer or an ACT to meet the prerequisite for the class (ACT English 18, Math 22, Reading 22)
- CCP is not a high school class!
 - Professors do not call your parents if you are failing
 - You do not get reminders to turn in your work
 - You must follow the syllabus and hunt out answers to questions on your own
 - You must communicate through their email system
- Transcribed credits follow you from college to college
 - You are starting your college transcript so make sure you are ready
 - Even though you pass a class with a C or D, it might not count toward a program or major and you may have to retake it
- How do you start the process of CCP?
 - If taking in our building, sign up for the class when you schedule
 - Apply to the college or university you wish to take classes through
 - Attend the CCP Information night (mandatory meeting for you and parents)
 - Fill out the intent to participate form by March 31 of each year
 - Make sure you qualify (might need to take an accuplacer or ACT test)
 - After enrolling, sit down with your college counselor to schedule your classes
 - Bring your college class schedule to your high school counselor for review
- Communication
 - Make sure this is something YOU want to do. Talk with your parents. You should be leading this process. Not your parents
 - Communicate with professors/instructors through email or in person. Work with success coaches if you are struggling.
