Course Objectives: The eleventh-grade course is an overview of American Literature across the major forms and genres (short story, novel, poetry, drama, and nonfiction) using the board adopted textbook. The larger works studied in this class are The Great Gatsby, The Crucible, Death of a Salesman, Narrative of Frederick Douglass, Great American Poems and A Raisin in the Sun. We will also read one selection of British Literature, Dr. Jekyll and Mr. Hyde. Writing assignments will include several short essays (2-3 pages).

Materials: Composition notebook for grammar, loose-leaf paper, binder or folder for this class, pencil, small page markers (sticky notes).

## Assignment Policies:

- Homework is due at the beginning of the period.
- English 11 courses will follow the school policy for an excused absence. A student whose absence was not excused will not be granted extended time. If you are absent, please check Google Classroom to see what you missed. You are responsible for getting this information.
- All final drafts of major written assignments are to be typed (12 point font, double spaced, Times New Roman) and must adhere to the essay format (APA) unless otherwise specified.
