Quizzes: Will be given at the end of major concepts within teaching units.

Unit Tests: Will be given at the end of teaching units. One unit will cover 4-6 chapters out of the text.

Homework/Check In's: Music theory has concepts and procedures that must be practiced to be mastered. You will usually have time in class for this practice, but will periodically have homework to be completed for a grade.

Composition Project: The culminating project of this course will be for the student to apply all of the concepts discussed in class to create his/her own musical composition.

Class Participation/Binder: A student's participation in classroom discussion is critical for not only their growth but the growth of their classmates. Students are expected to engage in classroom discussions and examples. Students will also be expected to maintain an organized 3 ring binder with tabbed dividers. Students will keep classroom materials, homework, notes, projects, and staff paper in the binder. Binders will be checked for these materials.

- In case of an absence, students are responsible for making up work in a timely manner. All unit homework and quizzes must be completed before the unit test.
