It is available 24/7 and is confidential. Calls are answered by trained professionals who will answer your questions and listen to your concerns in a non-judgmental manner. The staff can help anyone looking for local resources or those who are in crisis such as suicide attempts or threats, domestic violence, child or elder abuse, homelessness or in need of substance abuse treatment. Its mission is simple: to promote healthy prenatal outcomes for pregnant women, to enhance the development of very young children, and to promote healthy family functioning. EHS serves pregnant moms and infants and toddlers with prenatal, home-based, or center-based services year-round. *Early Head Start provides:* Services to pregnant moms, infants, and toddlers birth through 36 months; Individualized services to help parents achieve independence and self-sufficiency; Connections to

area agencies through resources and referrals including social services, medical, dental, physical, nutrition, mental health services, and disability services; all coupled with parent education, leadership, volunteerism, skill-building, goal-setting, and career opportunities. Children with disabilities are provided extra support with partnerships with the Knox County Board of Developmental Disabilities and the Help Me Grow program. Home-based and prenatal services with visits 90-minutes per week in your home, and regularly scheduled opportunities to join with other parents and guardians of infants and toddlers for social time, learning activities, and support groups. Center-based services for full-day, full-year childcare (for parents who are working or enrolled in school). Services to families qualifying at 100% of the federal income guidelines; contact us for more information at 740-397-1344.



SafeZone: New Directions offers a free LGBTQ+ 101 training, called Safe Zone. LGBTQ+ folks sometimes question whether they will feel safe, welcomed, or supported in a new environment. There is a pressure to already know how to be LGBTQ+ inclusive. And while many of us want to be, we don’t necessarily feel comfortable with the language, with our own level of understanding, and don’t know where to go to learn more. Safe Zone trainings are safe places for people to get more information.

Stewards of Children: Adults are taught how to prevent, recognize and react responsibly to child sexual abuse. This 3-hour training is designed for individuals concerned about the safety of children. Find out more about the training at www.D2L.org.

Stand Up Speak Out (See the Signs): The purpose of this program is to teach participants basic information about domestic and sexual violence, as well as how to intervene as a bystander. Participants learn the about different types of intimate partner violence and discuss the power and control associated with these relationships. Participants also learn and practice a variety of ways to be an active bystander and discuss specific examples of what this may look like, what words to say, how to keep themselves safe, and who to contact in a variety of situations.

Triple P Programs in Knox County: Group – for everything you want to know. Be prepared for anything raising kids or teenagers can throw at you with the toolkit of parenting strategies you get in this small group course. Usually, parents meet over 4-8 weeks. You're not alone!

Discussion Groups - for common parenting problems - parents with the same single problem join a two-hour group that provides practical solutions. Choose from topics tailored for parents of younger kids or teens.

Primary Care - for everyday problems - a problem or two with your child? Try a quick, tailored way to get strategies to help. Just you and a Triple P provider. Approximately four sessions/15-30 minutes each.

Seminars - positive parenting in a nutshell - even when parenting is great, a few tips can help make life easier. Get fresh ideas for raising kids in our 90-minute seminars. Choose from three different topics.
