


Sophomore Class Meeting

What's Important your Sophomore Year?

- ❑ It is your “shopping” year. Trying to decide what is next – KCCC, CCP, 4-year college prep?
 - ❑ Attendance, Grades, Credits are all very important.

Graduation Credit Requirements

- English - 4 credits (1/2 U.S. Literature, 1/2 Writing)
- Math – 4 credits (includes Alg.2)
- Science – 3 credits (Biology, Physical, other)
- Social Studies – 3 credits (U.S., World, Government)
- Health – 1/2 credit
- P.E. – 1/2 credit (two semesters or two waivers)
- Fine Art – 1 credit (band, choir, art, trends, etc.)
- Financial Literacy - 1/2 credit
- Electives – 3.5 credits
 - Total required – 20 credits

Graduation Requirements

It's Your **Future.** Get **Ready.**

Before you know it, you'll be receiving your high school diploma. Ohio is giving you new ways to show the world what you can do with it.

As a student entering ninth grade on or after **July 1, 2019**, Ohio's new high school graduation requirements give you more flexibility to choose a graduation pathway that builds on your strengths and passions – one that ensures you are ready for your next steps and excited about the future.

First, cover the basics

You must earn a minimum total of 20 credits in specified subjects and take your required tests. Then, decide how you will round out your diploma requirements.

English language arts	4 credits
Health	½ credit
Mathematics	4 credits
Physical education	½ credit
Science	3 credits
Social studies	3 credits
Electives	5 credits

Other Requirements

You also must receive instruction in economics and financial literacy and complete at least two semesters of fine arts. Your district may require more than 20 credits to graduate.

Second, show competency

Earn a passing score on Ohio's high school Algebra I and English II tests. Students who do not pass the test will be offered additional support and must retake the test at least once.

Is testing not your strength? After you have taken your tests, there are three additional ways to show competency!

Option 1.

Demonstrate Two Career-Focused Activities*: Foundational

Proficient scores on WebXams
A 12-point industry credential
A pre-apprenticeship or acceptance into an approved apprenticeship program

Supporting

Work-based learning
Earn the required score on WorkKeys Earn the OhioMeansJobs Readiness Seal

Option 2.

Enlist in the Military

Show evidence that you have signed a contract to enter a branch of the U.S. armed services upon graduation.

Option 3.

Complete College Coursework

Earn credit for one college-level math and/or college-level English course through Ohio's free College Credit Plus program.

Graduation Requirements

Third, show readiness

Earn two of the following diploma seals, choosing those that line up with your goals and interests. These seals give you the chance to demonstrate academic, technical and professional skills and knowledge that align to your passions, interests and planned next steps after high school.

At least one of the two must be Ohio-designed:

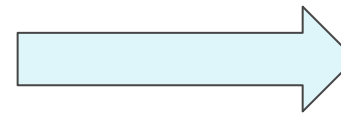





Information about the KCCC

□ How do you apply?

- online due by November 16 at midnight for first round picks.

□ What is dual school?

- Student takes lab at KCCC and academic courses at MVHS **IF** we can get it to work out.

□ Can you still participate in activities?

- Band/ Orchestra may conflict with academic schedules. See your counselor for more details.
- Sometimes this works out for your Junior year but conflicts with COOP your senior year.

□ All credits earned at KCCC count toward graduation. You are still a MVHS student.

Recommendations for the KCCC

- English – 2 credits
- Math – 2 credits
- Science – 2 credits
- Social Studies – 2 credits
- Health – ½ credit
- PE – ½ credit (or 2 seasons w/ waiver submitted)
- Elective – 1 credit

Total = 10 credits



Part time College Credit Plus Opportunities

- ▣ College Credit Plus Program
 - Have to fill out an Intent to Participate Form by March 31
 - Meet Pre-req's for the college class (ACT or SAT)
 - Attend an informational meeting in January
 - Students can choose to take 1 or more classes at a college campus and still take courses at the high school (maximum 30 semester hours / year)

Full Time College Credit Plus Opportunities for Juniors

□ The Knox Initiative


- Full time at COTC 11th and 12th grade and graduate with an Associates of Arts Degree at the same time you graduate high school

□ College U – Business


- Full time at KCCC during 11th grade and Full time at COTC during 12th grade and graduate with an Associates Degree in Business
- Students in these programs can not take any additional courses at the high school without a fee as they are full time and fall under CCP guidelines


What Do Colleges Look For?

- Quality of courses taken
 - Grade point average (should be 3.0 or above)
 - ACT and SAT test scores
 - School and Community activities
 - Volunteerism
 - Letters of Recommendation
- 


Ohio Board of Regents College Prep Recommendations

- English – 4 credits
 - Social Studies – 3 credits
 - Foreign Language – 3 credits or 2+2
 - Science – 3 credits
 - Math – 4 credits (including Alg. 2)
 - Fine/Performing Art – 1 credit




